## Welcome To Saint David's!!!

Saint David's Episcopal Church is open to all people, regardless of race, faith tradition, or sexual orientation. The presence of newcomers and visitors enriches our life together and encourages us in our ministry.

If you are just visiting for the day, please sign our guest book in the vestibule. If you are considering joining our community, fill out the form found on the fly leaf of this leaflet, and put it in the collection plate, or give it to one of the ushers, so we can be in touch with you.

### All are welcome to receive Holy Communion at the Lord's Table.

If you would like to receive Communion, but are unable to come up to the railing, please speak to one of the ushers, and they will arrange to have Communion brought to you.

If you do not wish to receive Communion, but would like to receive a **Blessing**, come to the rail during Communion and fold your arms over your chest and the priest will deliver a blessing to you.

**"Gluten-free" communion wafers**, that do not come into contact with any wheat products, are available. If you need to have such a wafer at communion, simply whisper "gluten free" to the clergy person administering the bread.

### About child care and Sunday school...

Children are always welcome at *all* of our services, and to enable them to participate in our worship at their level we offer nursery care at the late service on Sunday for infants to pre-schoolers, and Sunday school for all children up to grade five during the "academic year". Child Activity Bags can be found in the vestibule for children to use during the more adult-oriented times of our service. Also, the vestibule is equipped with a speaker in the event you need to leave during the service for any reason.

Sunday School (through grade 6) meets at 10:30 am, except during the summer (mid-June through Labor Day.)

Nursery care is available at the 10:30 (9:30) service year-round.

\*During the summer (mid-June through Labor Day), the Sunday 10:30 service is replaced with a Holy Eucharist at 9:30 am.

## About Saint David's Church

St. David's Church was formed in 1955 by a group of Episcopalians who recognized the need for a year-round church in Kennebunk (there are seven summer chapels in the area.) It was admitted to the Episcopal Diocese of Maine as an Organized Mission in 1956. The first services were held at the Kennebunk Methodist Church, on the North end of town. That building was later purchased by St. David's, and was consecrated as an Episcopal church in 1961.

Construction on our current building began in November of 1989, and it was consecrated in September of 1990. (Our old location on the north end of town is now St. Andrews Presbyterian Church.)
